Mr. Charles Baisey is Training Director of the Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) Program for the Public Safety and Security (PS&S) Division of the Texas Engineering Extension Service (TEEX), a part of the Texas A&M University System. Mr. Baisey manages the WMD program area responsible for development, scheduling and delivery of the Office for Domestic Preparedness Threat and Risk Assessment and Enhanced Threat and Risk Assessment courses. Additionally, his team supports the private sector terrorism prevention and mitigation with the threat-based Vulnerability Assessment Strategy, Design and Mitigation course.

Mr. Baisey joined TEEX in March 2003 after holding several managerial positions in private industry. While working for the National Emergency Response and Rescue Training Center (NERRTC), he was promoted to Program Coordinator where he coordinated the development, scheduling and delivery of the Office for Domestic Preparedness State Homeland Security Assessment and Strategy Technical Assistance to Jurisdictions and States.
